


"More than any other city, Tokyo demonstrates that 'city' is a verb and not a noun." – Toshiko





- 3 Nights Tokyo (東京) is Japan's capital and the world's most populous metropolis. It is also one of Japan's 47 prefectures. Prior to 1868, Tokyo was known as Edo, a small castle town. We explore the city's most famous sites.
- 1 Night Matsumoto is the gateway to Japan's Alps and home to its oldest Shogunate castle, built in the 1500s. We experience a stop-over in a Japanese Ryokan Hot Springs Hotel with traditional Japanese stylings.
- <u>1 Night</u> Takayama is a city in the mountainous Hida region of Gifu Prefecture. Takayama retains a traditional touch, like few Japanese cities have today, and is famous for carpentry from the feudal ages.
- <u>2 Nights</u> Kanazawa's unchallenged main attraction is Kenrokuen, one of Japan's three best landscape gardens, but considered the most beautiful. This old castle town & its Nagamachi samurai district are remarkable.
- <u>3 Nights</u> Kyoto, Japan's capital for 1,000 years and the Emperor's residence from 794 until 1868, it survived history nearly unscathed and is a priceless collection of temples and shrines. Jidai Matsuri festival, here we come!
- **2 Nights** Infamous for the site of the bombing in WW2, **Hiroshima** has grown into a vibrant and fascinating city, the very heart being the Peace Memorial Park. Great food, fun nightlife and beautiful blue Hiroshima Bay.
- <u>1 Night</u> Takachiho is a town in northern Miyazaki Prefecture that is steeped in Japanese mythology. Takachiho is known as a "power spot," a place of profound religious importance and natural beauty.
- **2 Nights** Its rich history, culture and location around a narrow inlet make **Nagasaki** one of Japan's most intriguing cities. The Portuguese and Dutch influences give Nagasaki a very interesting contrast.
- 1 Night Fukuoka is closer to Seoul than to Tokyo. It was selected in the "Food' category as "Best in Travel 2023" by Lonely Planet. The famous Japanese Wagyu Beef is a must try for us here as well as other specialties too.
